






The building is intended for daily operations that will go beyond the normal school calendar year, for morning and evening activities. The design for this 5 story building, located on an acute angle site will be the largest building in a mostly residential neighborhood. Yet, the use of masonry, stone in articulated details that relate to neighboring structures will make the school relate to its context.

It is intended to be read as an assembly of related building components. A corner tower, clad in gold copper and glass will act as both building anchor and hinge, allowing a clean corner return.


